CONDITIONS OF THIS PERMIT

1. The permittee shall exercise this privilege subject to the supervision of the Superintendent, and shall comply with all applicable laws and regulations of the area.
2. Damages - The permittee shall pay the United States for any damage resulting from this use which would not reasonably be inherent in the use which the permittee is authorized to make of the land described in this permit.
3. Benefit - Neither Members of, nor Delegates to Congress, or Resident Commissioners shall be admitted to any share or part of this permit or derive, either directly or indirectly, any pecuniary benefit to arise there from: Provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to extend to any incorporated company, if the permit be for the benefit of such corporation.
4. Assignment - This permit may not be transferred or assigned without the consent of the Superintendent, in writing.
5. Revocation - This permit may be terminated upon breach of any of the conditions herein or at the discretion of the Superintendent.
6. The permittee is prohibited from giving false information, to do so will be considered a breach of conditions and be grounds for revocation: [RE:36 CFR 2.32(a)(3)].
7. Permittee will comply with applicable public health and sanitation standards and codes.

APPENDIX SPECIAL PARK CONDITIONS SPECIAL USE PERMIT

This permit is granted subject to the following conditions:

1. Permittee and all participants authorized therein must comply with all of the conditions of this permit and with all reasonable directions of the National Park Service.
2. All walkways, roadways and park structures must remain unobstructed to allow for the reasonable use of these areas by pedestrians, vehicles and park visitors.
3. Demonstration/rally participants will register upon entering the park at the event registration area (see attached map) operated by permittee or representative of the permittee.
4. All participants will be identified by bands, bracelets or lanyards for identification purposes specified by permittee.
5. All persons/participants who carry firearms as part of this permitted demonstration are expected to know and comply with the various applicable Federal and State (NC) laws (see attachments) regarding firearms.
6. No firearms of any sort will be allowed in the park visitor center (federal building) even for restroom purposes. Porta-johns have been authorized and will be staged near the demonstration area.

7. No trees, shrubs or other plants may be trimmed or damaged in any manner.
8. The digging of holes or disturbing the ground to accommodate tents, awnings or signs is prohibited.
9. Reserved parking spaces will be provided for the disabled, media, emergency vehicles and the permittee at Tour Stop #8 parking lot near the participant registration area.
10. All other participants (50 cars estimated) will be parked on the Tour Road between Tour Stop #7 and #8 for close proximity to the registration area and event. All participants should enter the park tour road off Old Battleground Road (near Tour Stop #3 on map). Park event staff will direct them to the parking area.

PERMITTEE IS RESPONSIBLE FOR READING AND ADHEREING TO THESE ADDITIONAL CONDITIONS.

Park Event Staff

Park event staff will be identified by orange and/or green safety vests. The event staff is here to help, assist and guide your participants to appropriate parking, registration location and the demonstration area. Event staff will be aware of all first aid/EMS stations, water and restrooms. Event staff are not law enforcement officers but will have direct communications with law enforcement personnel and are instructed to notify them of any disorderly conduct among participants or spectators.

Public Information/Media

The National Park Service will provide a Public Information Officer(s) (PIO) to address any questions concerning this demonstration from the public, media or participants on behalf of the government. The PIO will be centrally located near the registration area. The permittee will provide media packets for press attending the demonstration and will designate a person(s) to act in the same capacity as the PIO to address questions on the (Restore The Constitution) group/participants behalf.

Donations

This permit authorizes the in-person solicitation for money if it occurs within the confines or the permit area as part of your ongoing activity (ISKCON v. Kennedy 61 F.3d 949 D.C. Cir.1995). All currency must be maintained and stored out of public view at all times. Requesting a donation in exchange for merchandise constitutes a sale is not allowed unless it comports with the NPS sales regulation found at 36 CFR 7.96(k).

Food Service

Food vendors have not been requested nor authorized for this event.

Filming/Photography and Electronics

Filming and/or photography of this event for news stories, historical record and documentary purposes are authorized. The permittee is to provide a sample of credentials for these individuals for identification purposes and easy recognition by the NPS. A small public address system has been authorized for use during this event. There is a power source provided on the amphitheater stage where the demonstration will take place. All electronic equipment must be removed from the park immediately following the conclusion of the event.

Demonstration Participants Possession of Lawful Firearms

All persons who carry firearms as part of this permitted demonstration are expected to know and comply with the various applicable Federal and State laws regarding firearms.
